

2024 Bruce County Visitor Survey Results





About This Report

Each year, Bruce County partners with eight municipalities to conduct a regional visitor survey, gathering valuable insights from people traveling throughout the area. Eight individual visitor surveys were created for each municipality, along with one comprehensive survey for all of Bruce County that asks visitors questions about their visit through Bruce County. The goal of the survey is to support tourism agencies, businesses, and local decision-makers by providing data that helps guide strategic planning and investment.

This report highlights data from the 2024 survey specific to visitors who indicated that they spent time in Bruce County. It's important to note that while these visitors did visit Bruce County, their spending and accommodation choices may have occurred elsewhere in the region.

In 2024, a total of 1,717 surveys were completed.

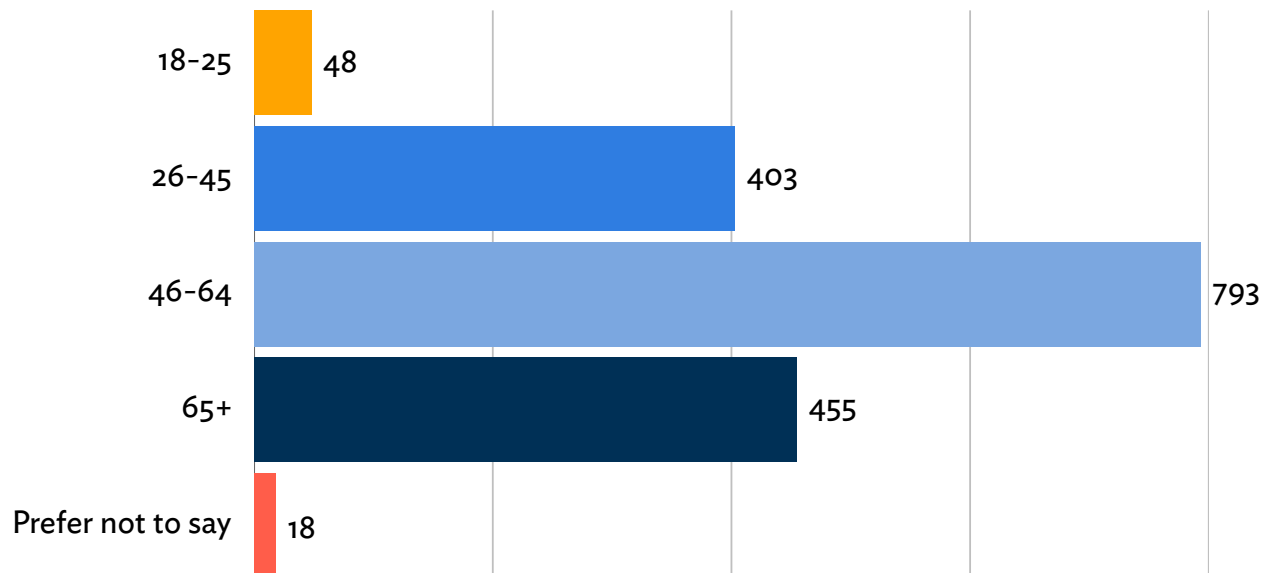
ABOUT THE SURVEY:

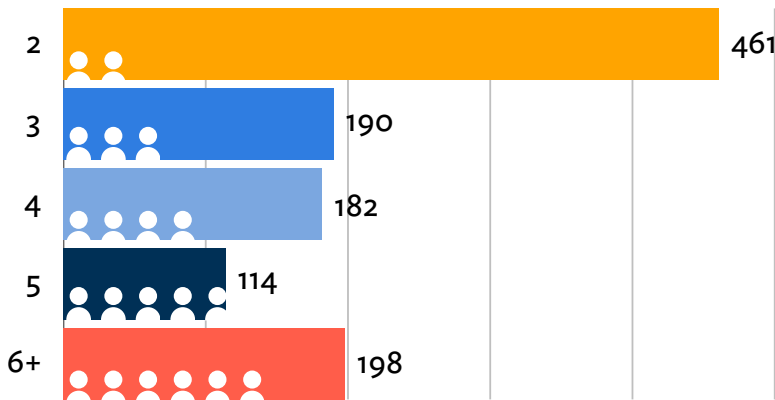

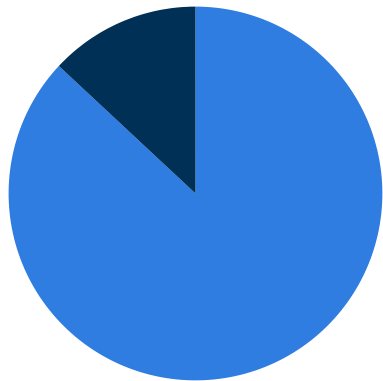

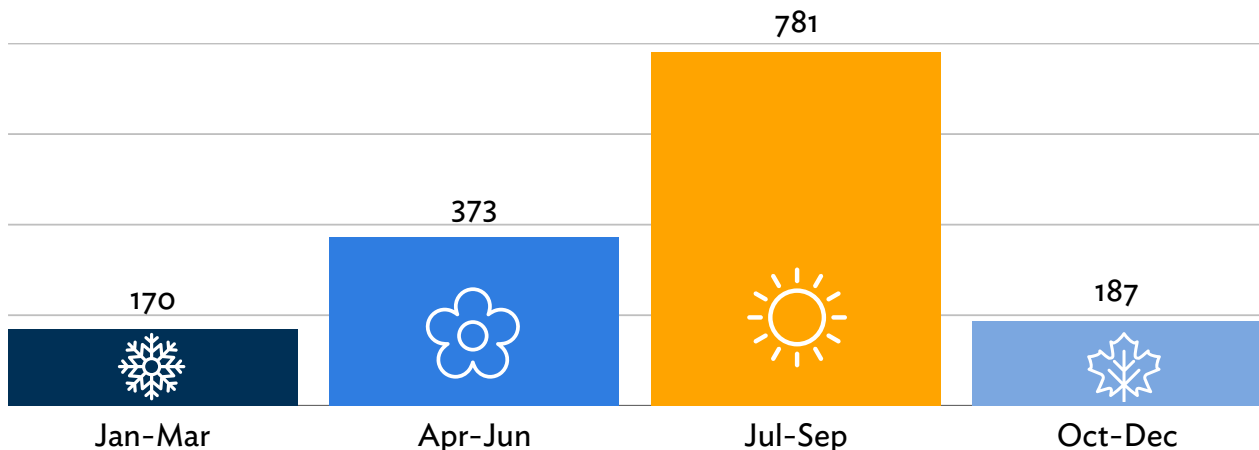


Visitation Patterns

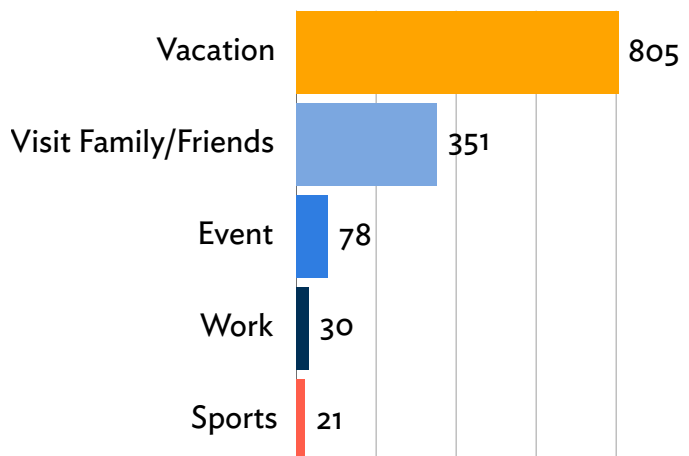

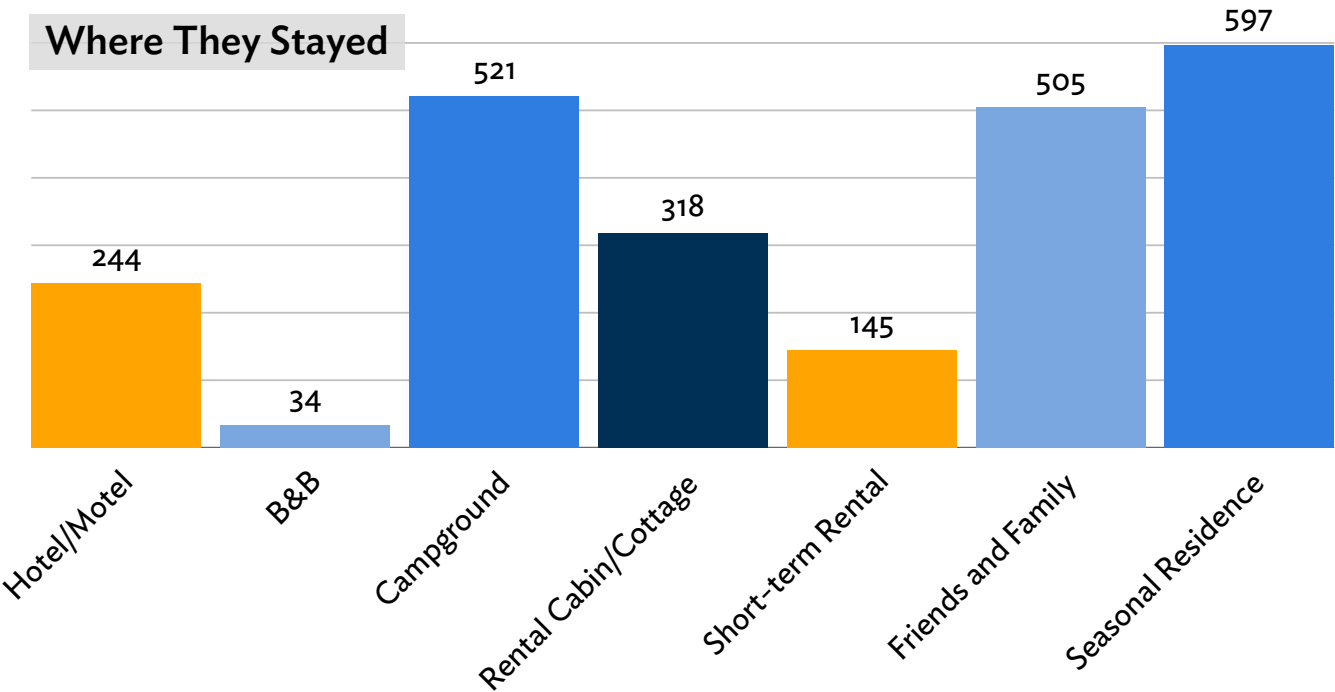

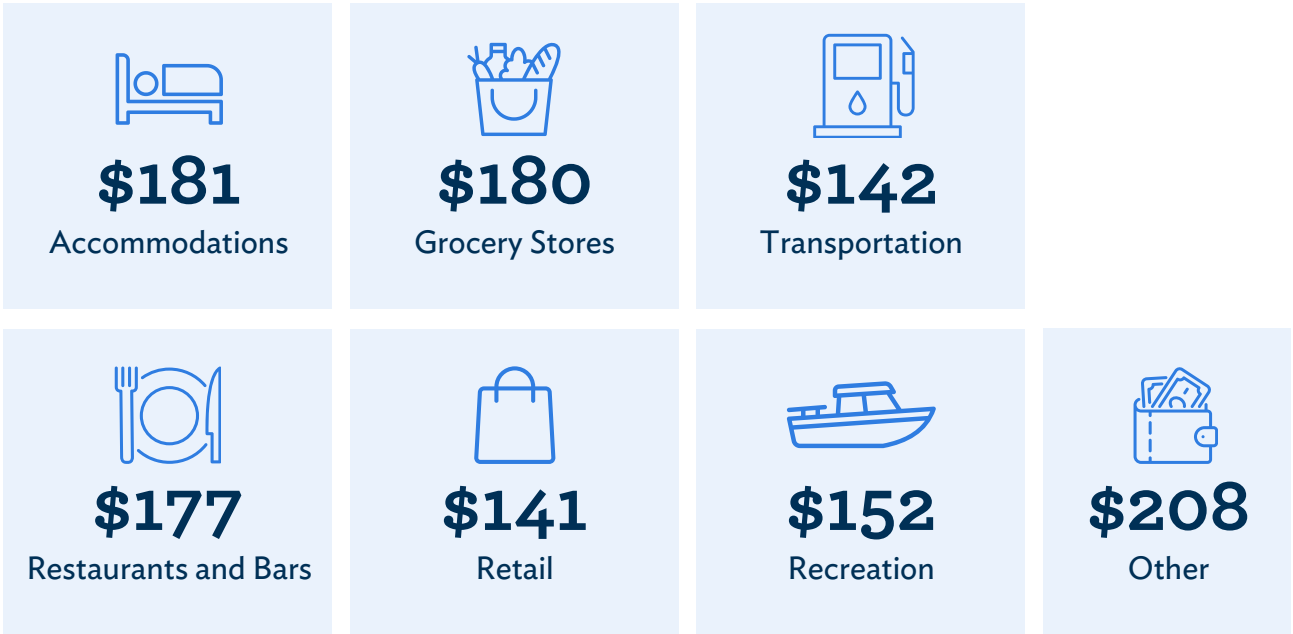


Accommodation and Spending

Average Amount They Spent



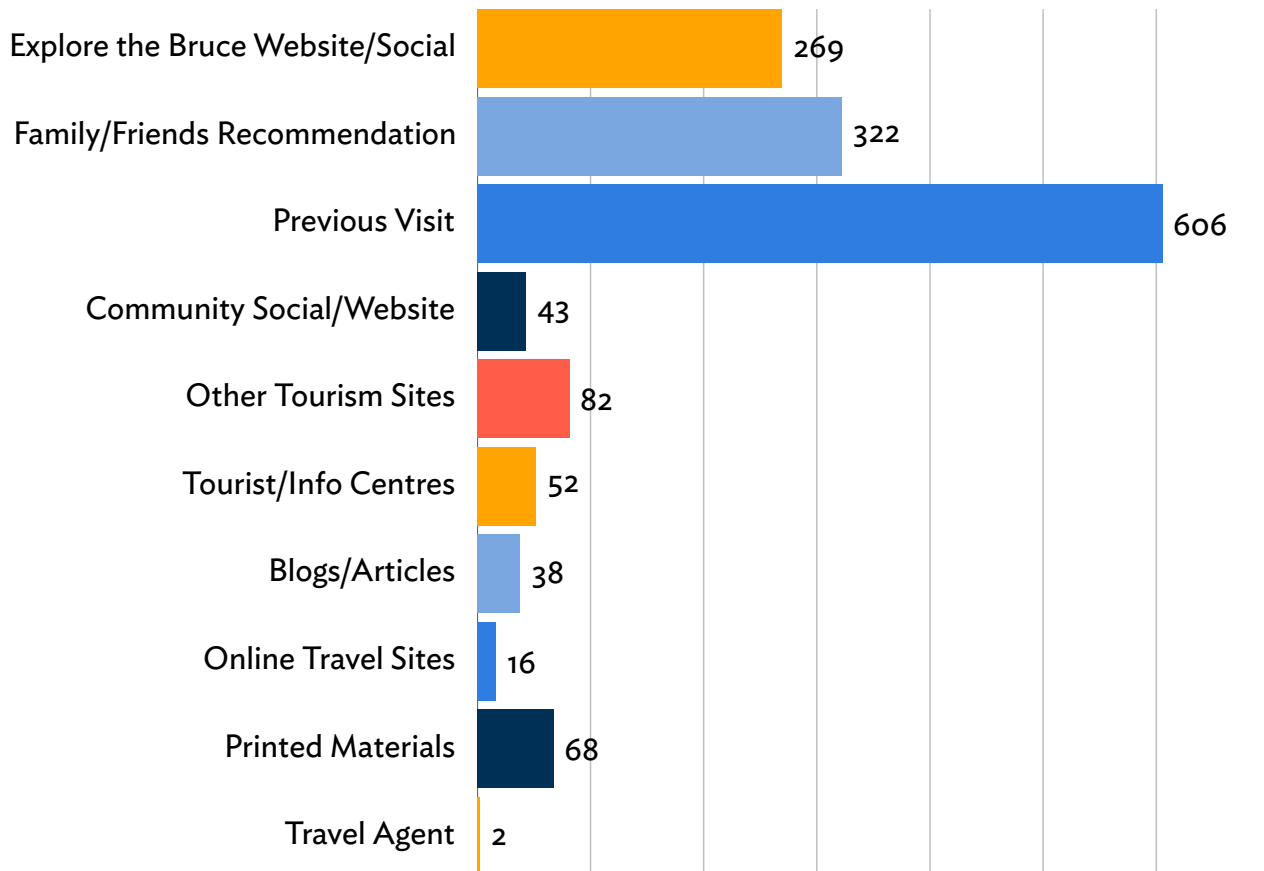

How Far in Advance Their Trip Planning Started



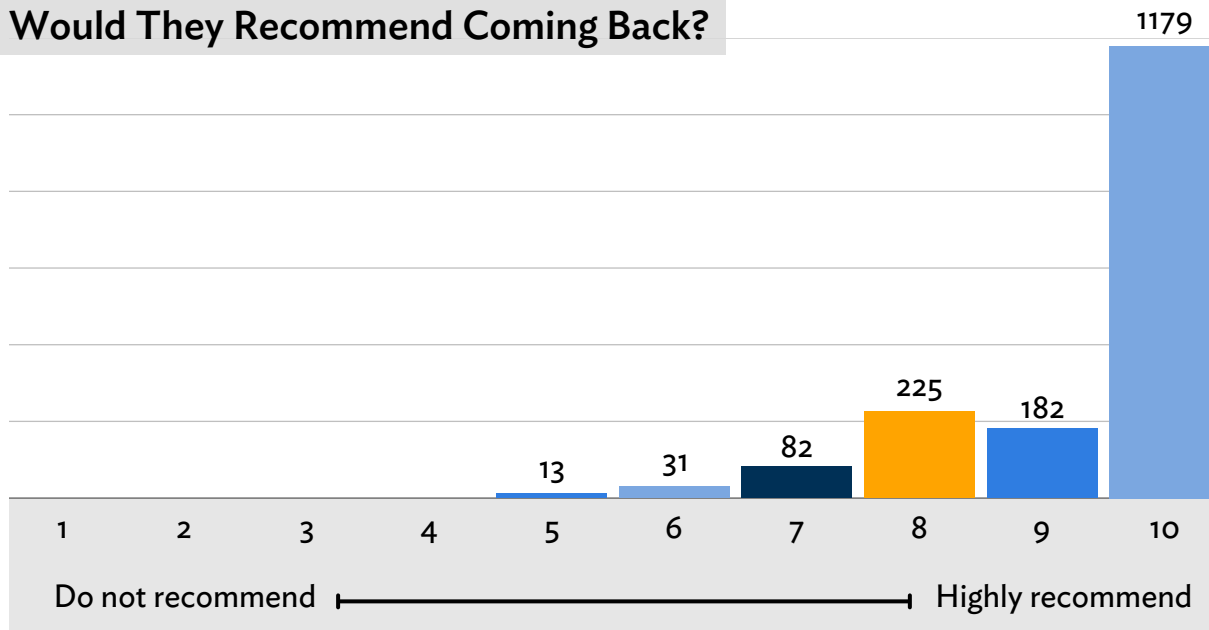

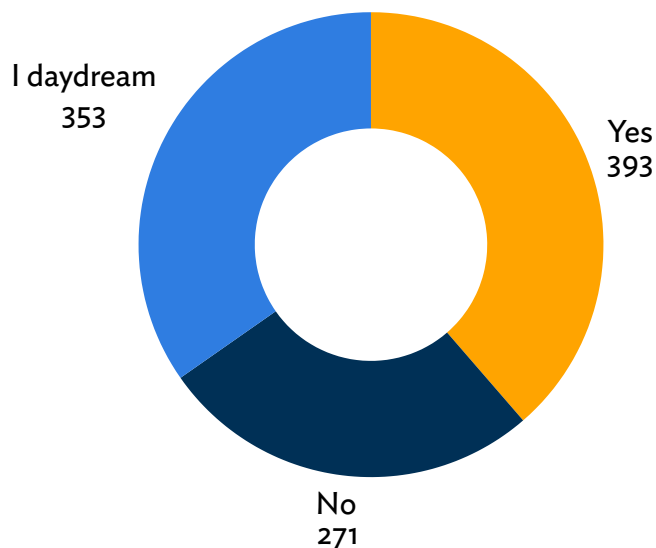
